



1. Before the stain has a chance to set, dampen it with water. Mix one teaspoon of liquid laundry detergent with ½ cup each white distilled vinegar and water. Using a cloth, gently dab—don't rub—the mixture onto the spot. Rinse with water. If stain comes out, launder as usual. If not, read on...

2. Rinse area with cool water, then pour a few drops of hydrogen peroxide and clear ammonia on it. Let it sit for five minutes; wash.

3. Stain's still there? Wash it one more time using a bleach sodium perborate (such as Clorox 2 or Snowy Bleach).

Simplest Ways to Beat the Heat


- ► Treat kids to ice pops, grapes, and watermelon-all are packed with water. (Offer plenty of plain old H2O to avoid too much sugar.)

Instead, stand with your back to the sun and watch the eclipse in a mirror. It will begin around 5 P.M. PST (around sunset on the East Coast) and last for about two hours, »



July 28–29 and August 12: Watch for meteor showers. You can see them across the country once darkness falls.

Most Shielding Sunblock

Surest Way to Catch a Firefly

Tips for the kindest way to catch one of these magical insects:

When: June, July, and early August, about 15 minutes after sunset.

Where: Open woodland with short grass, meadows, lawns, parks, or marsh—or anywhere the ground is damp.

How: Flick a small flashlight on and off.
Male fireflies flash their lights to alert females to their presence, so they'll mistake your light for a mat-

ing call. When they move toward you, use your hands or a butterfly net to catch the critters, which tend to fly slowly. If you like, put them in a covered jar with a small piece of apple or a handful of damp grass to maintain humidity. (Just don't

poke holes in the jar lid; it'll dry out the air.) Since fireflies live only about a week, you should let them go the next morning to give them a chance to mate.

Most Refreshing Lemonade

Nothing satisfies parched palates better on a hot day than this summertime favorite. It's easier than you might think to concoct it from scratch. This recipe makes a quart:

- Cut 4 lemons in half and remove the pits; squeeze the juice into a pitcher.
- ► Stir in 8 tablespoons sugar.
- Add 4 cups water and 1 to 2 cups ice cubes.
- ► Stir well.
- Serve in four 8-ounce glasses with a thin slice of lemon floating on the top.
